



MAINE ORTHOPEDIC REVIEW COLBY COLLEGE - WATERVILLE, MAINE JUNE 20 – JULY 1, 2022

THE COURSE

The Maine Orthopaedic Review is an 12-day course that starts with 5 ½ days of lectures and 6 ½ days of self-paced, computer-based instruction. All course instruction will take place in an air-conditioned building with modern classrooms.

ACCOMMODATIONS

Colby College is a private, liberal arts college on a beautiful, quiet campus. The quiet, retreat-like setting is ideal for this intensive course. Colby offers housing both in dorms on campus and in a new facility in downtown Waterville (The Main Street Commons), which is located approximately 2 miles from campus. As college residence halls, private rooms do not include private baths. All rooms on campus or in the Commons are assigned on the basis of the date we receive a reservation; therefore, early registration is suggested. Maid service, pillows, linen, blankets and towels are provided in both facilities. Televisions are not provided in either facility, though guests may stream on their personal devices. If you have a disability, please advise us on your registration.

Campus Dorms

There are double and single rooms in the campus dorms. Rooms are modest, yet clean and include a bed, dresser, lamp and fan. Air conditioning is not available in the dorms. Meals are included in the dining hall on campus.

Commons

The Commons is conveniently located in downtown Waterville near restaurants and shops. The air-conditioned suites have 4 or 6 private bedrooms with a shared living area, full kitchen and two bathrooms. Guests may be assigned to apartments with other participants, but will have a private, secure bedroom. An on-site fitness center is available and included in the fees. Parking is available and regular shuttle service is available to transport participants to campus throughout the day. Meals are included in the dining hall on campus. FEES

Fees include lodging, three daily meals (dinner June 20 thru breakfast July 1), a lobster bake and use of campus amenities.

Campus Dorms

A single room for the duration of the course is \$1,000; Double room (shared with another registrant), is \$900 per person. For less than 10 nights, the fee is \$100 per night. We do offer a weekly rate of \$500 (up to 6 nights).

Commons

For the Commons, the fee is \$1,200 (single room in a shared suite) for the duration of the course or a weekly rate of \$700 (June 20 – July 1) is available.

Check-in begins at 3:00 PM on **Monday, June 20**. All guests must vacate their rooms by **10:00 AM on June 26 or July 1**. MOR registrants may stay an additional night (July 2 only) for an additional fee of \$99 per person.

REGISTRATION

Begins Monday, June 20, at 3 p.m. in Cotter Union at the Pulver Pavilion Information Desk. Don't worry if you arrive late. The Information Desk will be open all night and a boxed dinner will be available for you.

TRANSPORTATION

Colby's campus is located just two miles off Interstate 95 and is easily accessible by a number of modes of transportation. Several major airlines provide service to Portland and Bangor and Amtrak has train service to Portland and Brunswick. Bus service is available to Waterville and to Augusta about 20 minutes away. Waterville is 190 miles, about three hours north of Boston. Rental cars and personal ground transportation are available in Portland, Bangor and Waterville. DIRECTIONS

Colby College is located in Waterville, Maine. Take Interstate 95 North to Exit 127, Waterville-Oakland. Turn right off the ramp. At first set of lights take a left onto Washington Street. MEALS

Meals are served in an air-conditioned campus dining hall with unlimited servings. The dining hall offers a wide option of menu options with many locally-sourced items. The Wales Memorial Tennis Courts are open to course participants who stay on campus. Please bring your own racquet and equipment. There are well-marked jogging trails on campus and there are also several golf courses nearby, including a 5 diamond course.
